#### The Candidacy of Mr. Hunt

Geo. W. P. Hunt this week makes formal announcement of his candidacy for the nomination of Governor of Arizona on the Democratic ticket. Mr. Hunt has served the people well as the State's highest executive, and upon his record he expects, and no doubt will receive, the endorsement of the electorate for another term. Other candidates have also announced for this most important office, and for awhile it was stated in certain quarters that Mr. Hunt would not again seek the office for another term, but the pressure of his many supporters throughout the State finally induced him to again make the race. At this time it is claimed unless a man of the Hunt calibre enter the field for the Democratic nomination and consequent election, all the work done in the past few years in the State toward constructive government and "absolute freedom from corporate tyranny" will be undone.

Mr. Hunt is the best beloved and most maligned man in Arizona. He is loved by his friends, who know him to be true; he has been weighed and not found wanting in the balance. He is thoroughly hated by his enemies—and, strangely enough, those enemies are mostly the representatives of big mining companies or other large corporations. It is a significant fact, and we believe, a good recommendation for Governor Hunt, that at least 90 per cent of those opposed to his administration are people interested in corporations, the patrician element of the commonwealth.

The people of Arizona have an idea that they are capable of governing themselves. The wealth of Arizona's resources, particularly in the mining industry, are enough to attract legitimate investments, without adding as a special inducement the privilege to interpret and administer laws. While welcoming capital to develop the State, and guaranteeing to those investments every safeguard that any Governor can make, Mr. Hunt has refused to go further and deliver the State over to the men who by the mere possession of wealth seem to think they should have special privileges in the making and enforcing of laws. Mr. Hunt refuses "to bend the knee to special privilege." He is not that kind of a governor. He is governor of the entire State, of all the people in the State. Neither the labor unions nor the mining magnates can tell him where to "head in."

With Governor Hunt, the poorest citizen has always been as important as the richest. Rich or poor, they all look alike to him, in the performance of his duties as chief executive. He is the great commoner of Arizona. Always he has stood for majority rule, for just rights of workmen as opposed to the unjust restrictions of the corporations; for the humane management of State institutions, and for progressive government.

A lot of people in this State and in Santa Cruz county are strong for Hunt. No other man in recent years has come to the front in any Western State with the following of Mr. Hunt. He stands head and shoulders above all the other aspirants for leadership because he has kept the faith. With abuse and obstacles almost unsurmountable, the patient, hard-working, unassuming Governor has steadily and unflinchingly battled for the cause of the people. It has been an uphill struggle all the way. He has made a good fight; more power to him.

It is a new thought to many farmers that their efficiency to a large degree depends upon the farm home. There is no question but that the nourishment which they receive and their home surroundings have an important effect upon their physical and mental efficiency. If this is true it is undoubtedly good business policy to pay especial attention to the farm home.
