EDITORIAL

TOO MUCH POCKET MONEY

The following editorial taken from the Dallas (Tex.) News is worthy of a careful perusal by every citizen of Patagonia and all others who do their banking business and trading in this town. By following this suggestion thousands of dollars of idle money could be put to work in and around this town and thereby assist in stimulating all lines of trade. Here is the way the News states it:

"Price on Pocket Money" would be a fetching title for a little homily which it was the good fortune of the members of the Dallas Lions' Club to listen to the other day. That distinguished Texan and New Yorker, Mr. Theodore H. Price, told them that they were probably guilty of carrying around more money in their pockets than was good either for them or the community. What is more, he proved it. Calling for an inventory of cash resources in the pockets of his auditors, he disclosed a total of \$2,187 for the ninety men present, a per capita of considerable more than \$20, four times the amount Mr. Price thought necessary to anticipate, with a reasonable degree of safety, the financial exigencies of a day for one at home. Mr. Price's thesis was that the aggregate of the surplus pocket money most of us ordinarily carry about with us is a huge subtraction from the credit resources of the country, since in the pocket it is unemployed, whereas in the banks it would be subject to enlistment in enterprises whose success serves the public welfare. The truth of this is rather obvious, but it is the customary fate of the obvious truth to have its significance ignored. Just now the economic ills of the country are due largely to an insufficiency of credit resources, to the inability of the banks to grant financial accommodation to all who need it and who could use it in ways that would be promotive of prosperity. But if the millions, tens and even hundreds of millions of money that lie hidden and idle were gathered together in the banks, they would have credit resources that would satisfy even the extraordinary demands that are now being made on them, in all likelihood. The fact that the idleness of a dollar has a social consequence akin to the idleness of a man is one which it would profit us to learn and appreciate."
