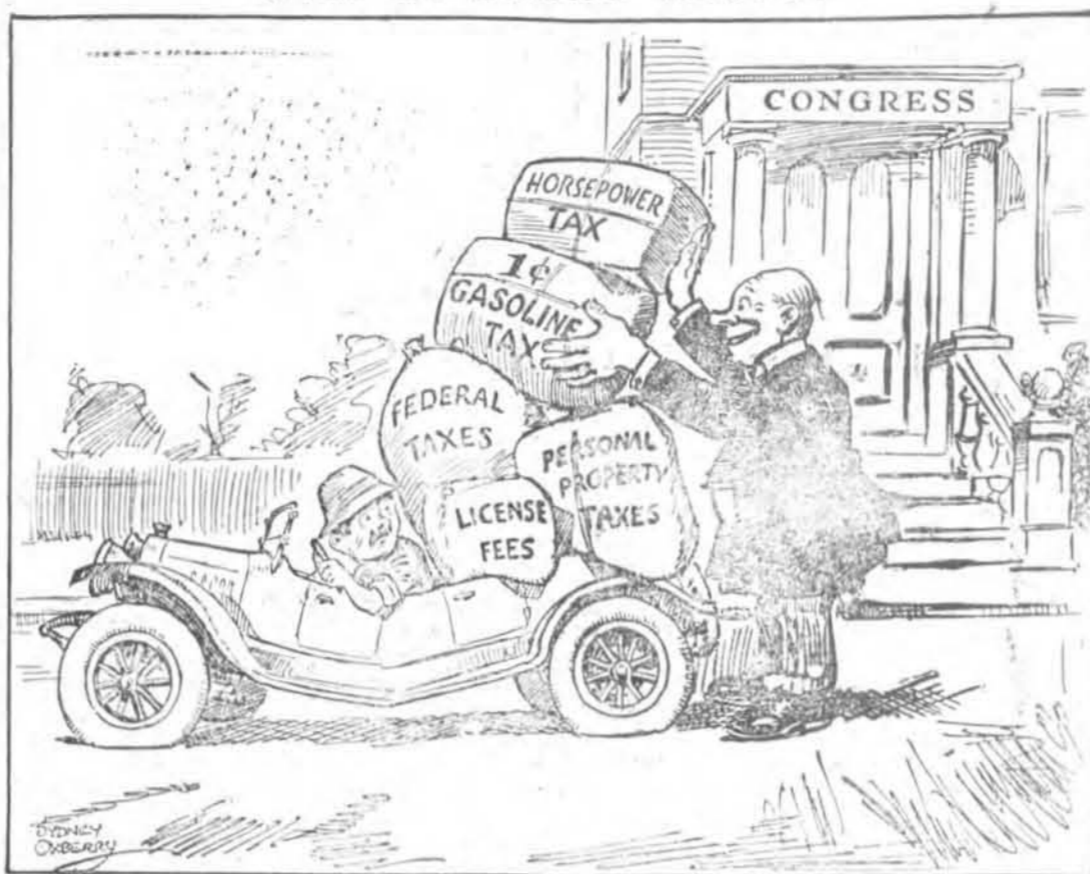


Can It Stand More?

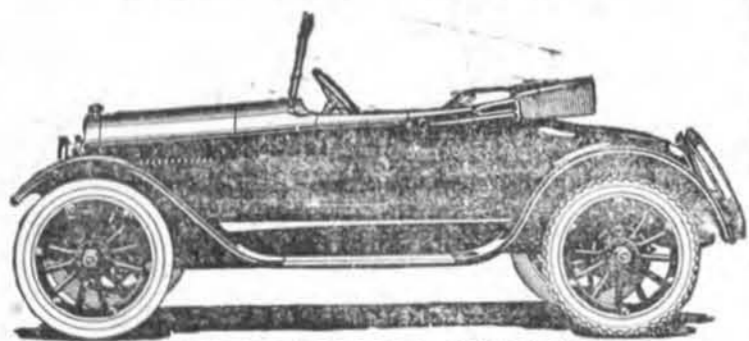

Editorial Comment

MUST RECOGNIZE CONDITIONS

There have probably been more arguments for and against the tariff question than on any other public issue except taxation. Regardless of our personal opinion, certain facts confront various industries of this country which, while paying American wages under American working and living conditions, must meet foreign competition. No wise man would suggest closing our doors to foreign competitors, for the simple reason that we must sell certain of our products in the foreign markets.

On the other hand, we must recognize the fact that certain commodities manufactured under foreign wage and working conditions may be landed on our shores at a price with which no American manufacturer can compete. Sugar and paper are typical western industries that can be wiped out of existence through lack of protection.

American wages and working conditions cannot be retained on a foreign commodity price basis. Think it over.

BREAD AND BUTTER PROBLEM FOR ALL

Taxes, labor and cost of material are the three things which will increase or decrease gold production. The price of gold is stationary and cannot be raised to meet changing costs of mining; hence the gold output will increase only as production costs drop.

Silver price fluctuates as other metals, but at the present time the Pittman act is saving American miners from ruinous losses.

Copper, lead and zinc, however, depend on industrial activities for their consumption. Production costs play a vital part in placing these metals on the market at a price which encourages their use.

Labor is taking its cut, and material and transportation costs are dropping. Taxes are a drain on the resources of mining properties, and at present spell the difference between profit and loss and ability of mines to operate.

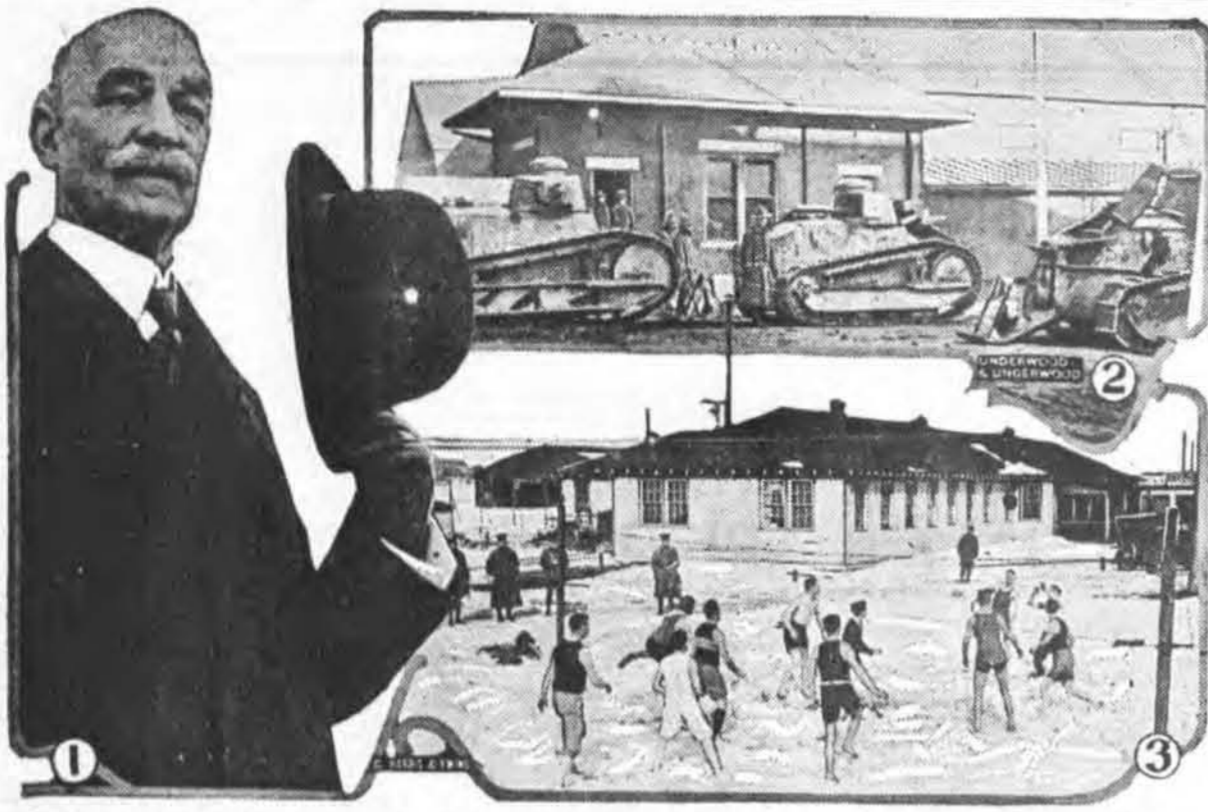

Dr. W. J. McGregor of Wilkesburg, Pa., Has No Legs, but Made Fast Run for Office.

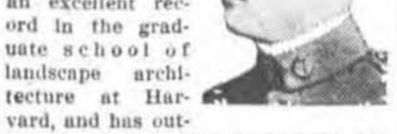
