Paris Mecca of Divorce Hunters

Americans and Other Foreigners Are Taking Advantage of Easy French Laws.

SECURITY IS THE CHIEF FACTOR

American Lawyer in Paris Declares the Whole Divorce Situation in France an Abuse and Scandal—Grounds for Decree.

Paris.—The increasing number of divorces in Paris by promiscuous Americans and other foreigners seeking relief from marital infidelity has led to many inquiries as to why the French capital apparently has become such a European Reno for discontented spouses.

Recent publicity in the United States of some divorces of Americans in Paris has caused an unpleasant feeling of apprehension among attorneys for others who have been contemplating divorce action.

Must Establish Residence. Provisional decrees usually may be obtained in France in from one to three months, and final decrees 50 days thereafter.

notice must be given through the state department. There are three grounds for divorce in France: adultery, conviction of a felony and cruelty. Both physical violence and mental anguish are accepted under the heading of cruelty.

The whole divorce situation in France, from the American viewpoint, is an abuse and a scandal," said Charles F. Beach, an American lawyer in Paris. "There is no suggestion of Reno in the attitude of the French courts, but French judges are not aware of the advantage that is being taken of them by Americans who are procuring divorces."

At the ministry of justice the suggestion that Paris is becoming a second Reno for American divorces is not well received. M. Lemerleux, first assistant to Minister of Justice Barthelemy, said that France was a liberal country regarding divorces, having been the first continental country to grant them to foreigners, under the law of 1884, and that possibly Paris was being visited for this purpose just as Rome was such a resort for Italians because of the lack of a divorce law in Italy.

Burglars Use Acid Test On the Family Silverware

A literal application of the acid test was made by burglars who ransacked the home of J. A. Gillies, Hamden, Conn., during the family's absence. The burglars carried acid with them to test the quality of the family plate and, after discarding such silverware as did not measure up to their standard, took tableware valued at \$3,000. Fur coats and necktie garments were taken at their face value.

WAGE EARNERS BENEFITED BY LAWS ENACTED

Annual Summary by Labor Law Association Shows Continued Extension of Safety and Health Measures in the Interest of the Workers.

New labor laws enacted by congress and more than forty states show continued gains in the protection of the safety and health of wage earners, although on the pressing issue of unemployment the legislative record is practically blank, according to a summary of the year's labor legislation issued by the American Association for Labor Legislation.

Of particular import is the progress made during the year in federal-state co-operation for maternity protection and for vocational rehabilitation of industrial cripples," says Secretary John B. Andrews. "Passing by congress of the Sheppard-Towner bill for maternity and infancy protection, crowning for victory a three-year intensive campaign, found six states prepared for immediate action, having accepted to advance the federal aid now available."

Immigration was restricted by congress in a law limiting the number of aliens of any nationality who may be admitted to the United States in any year to 3 per cent of the number of foreign-born persons of that nationality resident of the United States, according to the census of 1910.

Administration. Departments of labor and industrial relations were created, and the various existing commissions and bureaus consolidated or abolished in California, Minnesota, Montana, Ohio and Washington. The New York labor law was reworked, completely reorganizing the department of labor.

A. F. of L. Forty-One Years Old. The American Federation of Labor dates from November, 1881, when the Federation of Organized Trades and Labor Unions of the United States and Canada was formed. The American Federation of Labor as such did not come into existence until 1883, but in 1880 it acknowledged the continuity of its existence by dating the proceedings to 1838.

LABOR THE SUPERIOR OF CAPITAL

Extracts From Abraham Lincoln's First Message to Congress Recveal Position He Took. A correspondent of the New York Evening Post has the following to say concerning President Lincoln's idea of the relations between labor and capital: "Too many seem to have forgotten when President Lincoln stood on the question of capital and labor and his attitude toward strikes." I wish those persons would read the first annual message to congress of the great Republican leader on December 8, 1861. I will quote only a few sentences: "In my present position, I should sorely be justified were I to omit raising a warning voice against the approach of returning despotism. It is the effort to place capital on an equal footing, if not above, labor, in the structure of government. Labor is prior to and independent of capital. Capital is only the fruit of labor, and

FLOCK TO CANADA

Immigrants of High Order Settling on Western Plains.

Removal of Restrictions Necessary During the War Has Shown World's Faith in Dominion's Future.

For a period during the late war, and for a while after its close, there was put into operation by the Canadian government legislation restricting certain classes and people of the countries which were not lined up with the allied nations from being admitted to Canada. This was quite necessary, and the reasons for it will be so apparent that they need not be given. However, the time came, in the early summer of this year, when it was deemed possible to remove some of these restrictions. It was found that there were many who came under their ruling that were of a class that Canada needed and who needed Canada. The restrictions, doubtless, were drastic, but were useful. The news of their removal, sent broadcast, has met with such a response as to give ample evidence that they had not killed interest in Canada, and that faith in the Dominion as a country where a new existence, happy and fruitful, was as complete as ever.

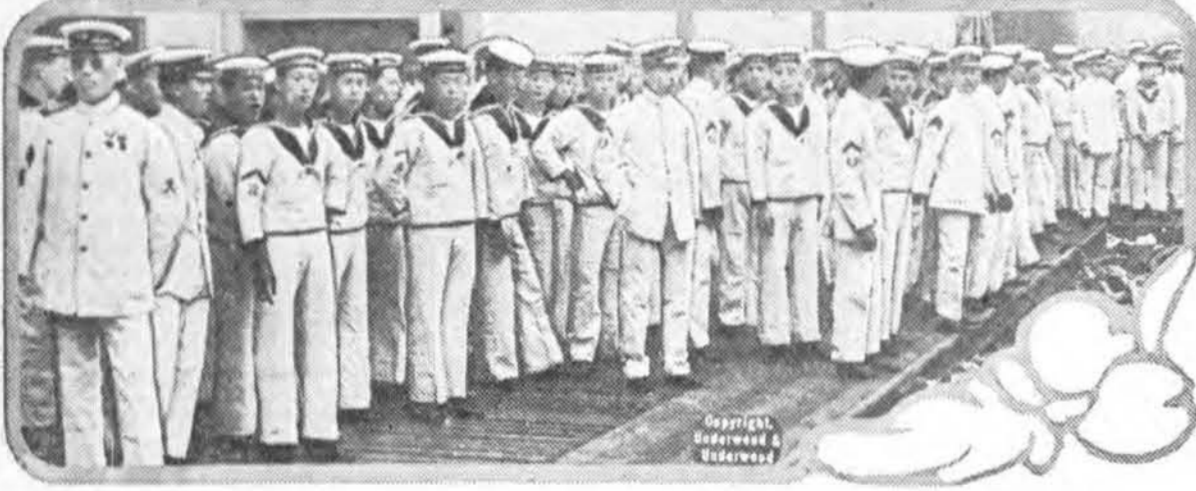

WONDERFUL RELICS FROM EGYPT

Interesting New Discoveries on View in London.

Graves of Courtiers and Royal Servants at Abydos Belong to Date as Unbelievably Remote as 5,000 Years B. C.

London.—Most intensely interesting are the relics brought back by Prof. Flinders Petrie, the great Egyptologist, and his colleagues from the tombs near Abydos. The precious fruits of last winter's search are on view at University college.

The graves at Abydos were those of courtiers and royal servants of the first dynasty kings, and the treasures that were buried with them belong to a date almost unbelievably remote—about 5,000 years B. C. These tombs were not known 20 years ago when Professor Petrie explored the famous tombs of the first dynasty kings.

The exhibition is rich in tablets of later dynasties from the same site. One of the eighteenth dynasty is memorable because the dead man does not pray for funeral offerings in the common form, but only that the gods may grant him "a heart that is sweet every day."

A great deal of important work was done also at Oxyrhynchos, notably in exploration of the great Roman theater which held 10,000 people—one of the noblest theaters of antiquity. Lion Near Crib. 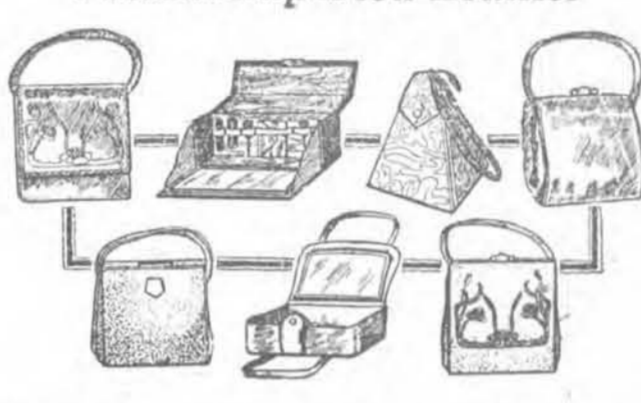
