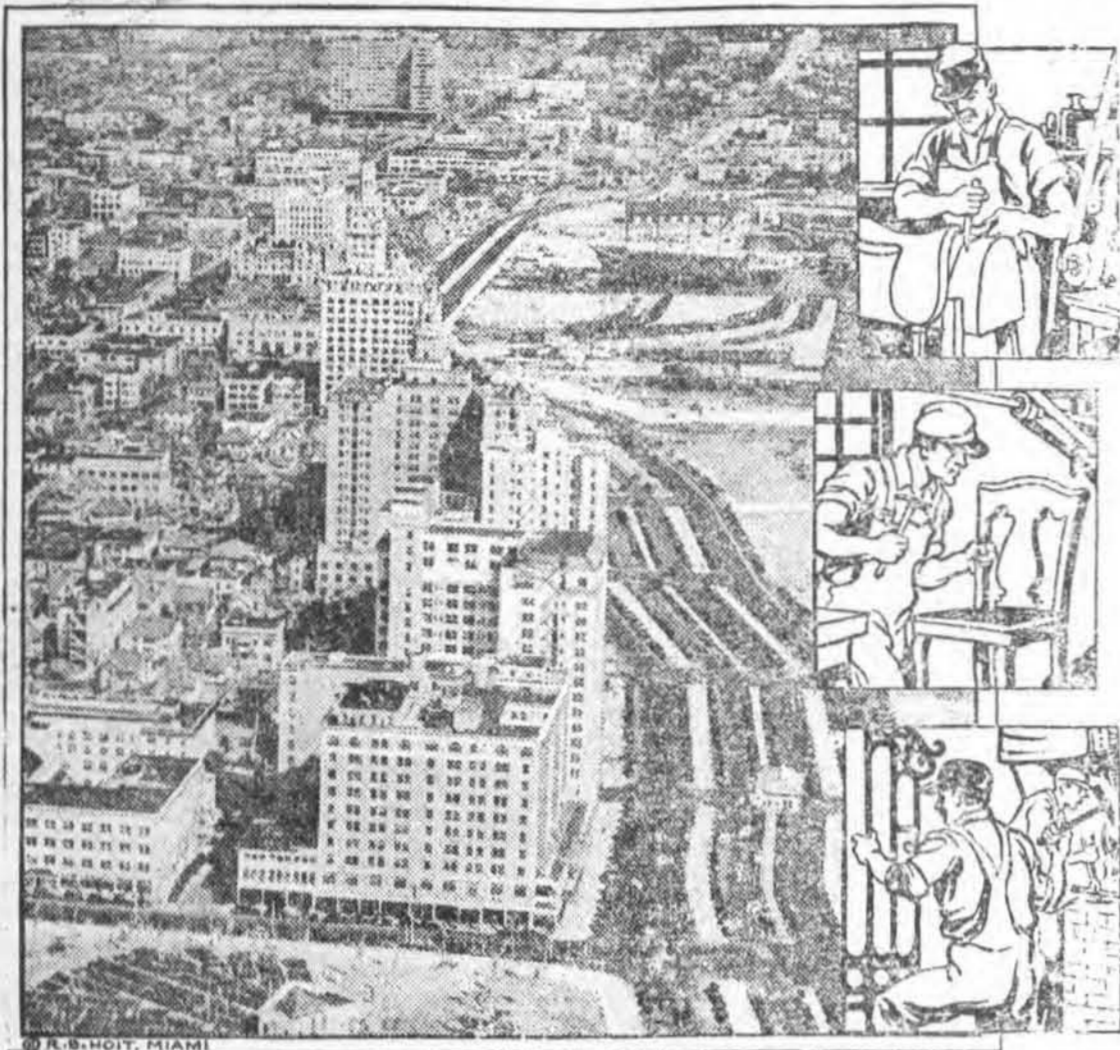




Miami's Industrial Exposition Shows Sunshine Is Not Florida's Only Product

Under the heading "Saving the County Money," in the Tuesday issue of the little hand-bill boastfully called a "daily" by its "little" publisher, the crowing still goes on about the wonderful savings the present board of supervisors are making. Here are some facts about that "saving": At the first meeting of the board four physicians put in bids for the position of county superintendent of health. All of them offered to do the work of that office for \$100 per month, which is \$75 less than has been paid in the past. The appointment was given to a Republican, Dr. A. V. Smelker, at \$150 per month—a loss to the county of \$50 per month. The superintendent of outdoor indigent relief, O. A. Smith, a Republican, was retained in that position at a raise in salary of \$25 per month—a loss to the taxpayers of \$25 per month. The "little" hand-bill publisher was awarded the contract for the county printing and publishing at a dead loss to the county of approximately 60 per cent of the total cost of that work for the ensuing year. If that is "saving" the taxpayers money, we have been taught the wrong kind of arithmetic. And the "little" publisher of the "little" near-daily and his "little" Man Friday, who trots around Nogales belittling the other newspapers of the county in order to gain a few inches of advertising will soon be in for a "chowdown."

many papers for return postage to this same office because no attention was paid to their notices to discontinue the practice. Don't talk to us about anything being "obscure" in the way of a newspaper. The Patagonian has the third largest circulation of the weekly newspapers of the state of Arizona and the paid-up subscribers in Santa Cruz county far exceed the paid-up subscribers of the blatant "little" imitation of a newspaper man who claims to own the Herald. The "little" weekly paper at Patagonia is not "raving about its loss of the county printing." It was not the lowest bidder and did not expect to get the contract. We are calling the taxpayers' attention to the fact that the contract was given to the HIGHEST bidder—at a heavy loss to taxpayers—and no more of them will read it than did last year. Two other "little" weeklies bid lower than The Patagonian for the county printing and to one of them the contract should have been given—if the laws were lived up to by the board.

GEORGE WASHINGTON George Washington, whose 195th birthday anniversary occurs on February 22, has been more widely discussed during the past year than usual, owing to the appearance of two new biographies written in a rather jargonistic vein. The authors, Rupert Hughes and W. E. Woodward, apparently have the documentary evidence with which to strip the Father of His Country of the halo which has surrounded him, particularly with respect to his private life. Many of the myths, like the cherry tree story, have been dispelled, and the false adoration bestowed by his early biographer, Woems, has been materially discounted. As a result, the real greatness of Washington has not been deprecatd, but has merely been transformed from a demi-god into a very human person, with a fair share of the frailties which characterize all mortals. Even though Washington did, as Mr. Hughes declares, indulge in all the frivolities of a gentleman of his day, including "foppery, dancing, gambling, police drinking and exquisite flirtation," it appears that he was conservative in his indulgences and

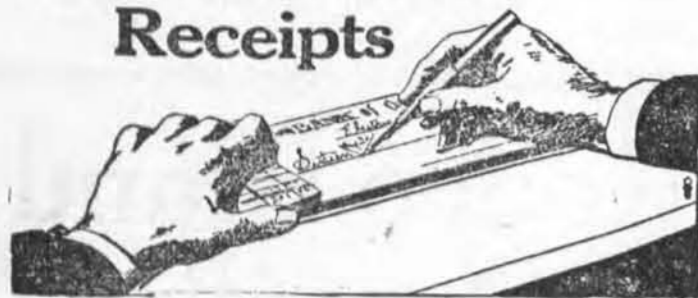
A Frock Invests Wisely in Vests

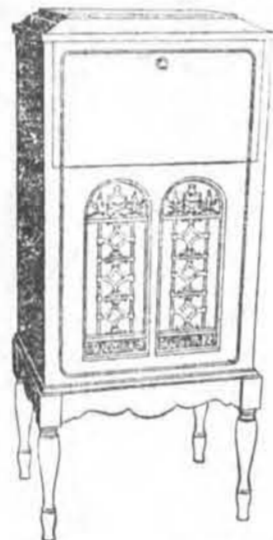

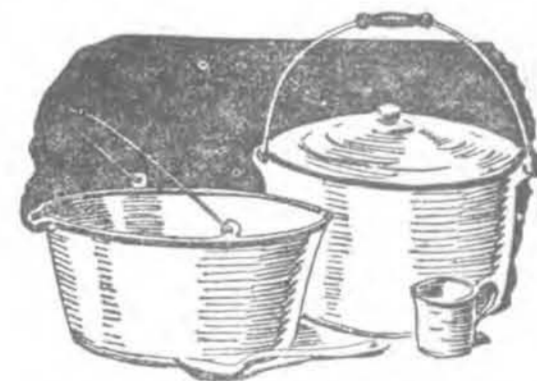
